




John 1:1-5 *'In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through Him all things were made; without Him nothing was made that has been made. In Him was life, and that life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it.'*

Some of you may be thinking that this is an odd passage from scripture to be referencing since it is Christmastime. Where is the birth story? Where are the angels, where are the shepherds, where are the animals, where are Mary and Joseph, what about the no room at the inn, and what happened to the wise men? (They do come along eventually.)

During this year of things being out of the norm I thought I would take us to a different sort of a birth story. In this year of trying to figure out how we are going to have a Christmas Eve service which might sort of include Christmas carols that could be sung together, which might sort of include candlelight, which might sort of include the birth story from St. Luke with its back and forth readings, and which might sort of include or exclude, in this case, many of our members—I thought the Gospel of John was the way to take a different look at things.



John has no birth story as we have come to know it in his gospel. He speaks of Jesus as 'the light'. For John Jesus is the 'true light' at that. 'The light that no darkness could overcome'. And that is what I want to focus on in this Messenger article. As this year has certainly been one of some rather significant darkness.

Many of you may know of someone or you yourselves might have lost loved ones this year to Covid-19. I just read that yesterday this pandemic has now killed more Americans in one day than the tragic event of 9/11. I got a message from my friends who live on the Pine Ridge Indian reservation in South Dakota. More than 1,600 of the people on the reservation have been infected, more than 60 have

died, 7 of their own family members have succumbed to this virus, and they are on a strict stay at home order.

Could we not use some of 'the light that no darkness could overcome' right now? I know I sure could.

The other day I heard a song on the radio entitled, 'You Can't Stop Christmas'. How true because no matter what we will still celebrate the birth of the Christ child. Whether we are together on Facebook. Whether we are together in a Zoom worship meeting. Whether we are together with family or whether we alone in our own homes. No matter what 'the light that shines in the darkness' will come because 'in Him was life, and that life was the light of men (and women)'. Of that we can be sure.

Thanks be to God that in this year we have had we can trust that God will be with us no matter what. That we will celebrate the birth of the Christ child. We can be assured that ultimately all will be well, that eventually we will return to some semblance of 'normal', and we will once again be together. Oh, it may not be next month or it may not be 2 or 3 months from now. But we will be together and then '**the light**' will shine brighter than ever.







KEEP SEEKING HIM





WE ARE NEVER ALONE

Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton

The room was spare and dimly lit. We sat on folding chairs in a circle— young Honduran women and some of us from the ELCA. We had come to Honduras to observe the work of [AMMPARO](#) (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities). This is the ELCA's strategy to help youth who have been forced to flee their home countries because of violence, abuse, extortion by gangs and extreme poverty. Amparo is the Spanish word for shelter or refuge.

In this case, [AMMPARO](#) partnered with the [Lutheran World Federation](#) and the Mennonites to resettle returned migrants—those who had tried to seek asylum in the United States but had failed or had been denied and deported back to Honduras.

One by one they told us their stories of fear and desperation. Not a one undertook the long and dangerous trek north on a whim. They told us about the abuse they had suffered, about family members who had been killed by gangs, about the inability to make a living because of the extortion by organized crime. They talked about the bitter sadness of leaving home and family, and the uncertainty of the future.

I remember one young woman in particular. She was pregnant when she tried to migrate to the United States. She had the baby somewhere along the way. She was far from home, mostly alone and desperately wanted her mother to be with her. None of this is what she had hoped for when she was growing up. Circumstances beyond her control had forced her into this new and strange existence. She and her baby were now back in Honduras—but not at home. Home was too dangerous.

Remember last Christmas? Remember all of the preparations, the travel to be with family? Remember the holy beauty of the Christmas Eve liturgy and receiving Christ's grace and forgiveness at his table? The shopping and Christmas caroling? The in-person gatherings? All that has changed.

The pandemic hasn't forced us from our homes but into our homes, sheltering in place, isolated. Not together, but physically distanced. Not gathered with family and friends, but forced apart because of the threat of infection. Forced by circumstances beyond our control into this strange existence. Oh, there will be Christmas carols piped into grocery stores and other essential services, but they will be painful reminders of how life used to be.

We are reminded of the experience of the exiles in Babylon: **“By the rivers of Babylon—there we sat down and there we wept when we remembered Zion. On the willows there we hung up our harps. For there our captives asked us for songs, and our tormentors asked for mirth, saying, ‘Sing us one of the songs of Zion!’ How could we sing the Lord’s song in a foreign land”** (Psalm 137)?

I told the young Honduran woman about another young woman who was forced to leave home because of a government decree. She, too, was pregnant and made a long and difficult journey. She, too, was far from home and without her mother when the baby came. She had to find shelter wherever she could. This wasn't what she had hoped for when she was growing up. Circumstances beyond her control had forced her into this new existence.

That young woman was Mary and the child was Jesus. Precisely in our distress, in our dislocation, the Lord shows up. Emmanuel—God with us—makes his home in the very places we find foreign or isolating. The young Honduran woman, and all of us, can find hope because of the birth of Mary's child. There is no God-forsaken place and we are never alone—not in hospital rooms, or sheltering in place, or Zoom calls or on dangerous roads.

Many of us will not be physically home for Christmas, but we are truly home in Christ.

Pacifica Synod has invested in training coaches to work with rostered and lay leaders one-on-one or in groups. Coaching provides an opportunity for rostered and lay leaders to experience a partnership focused on the unique objectives they want to achieve. A coach's role is to support a leader in naming challenging issues and identifying constructive responses to them. Pacifica Synod coaches are volunteering their time to create presentations and coaching opportunities that provide a hands-on resource for addressing your challenges.

The January 5 session is the seventh in the monthly series Coaching for All Seasons that began in July 2020. The Pacifica Synod Coaching Team designed this forum to provide encouragement and support to Synod leaders as we navigate the unknown. 




