



I feel rather safe in saying that most of us have some sort of a ritual or routine that we go through each day—especially in the morning. One thing that I generally do is to go upstairs, say ‘Good Morning’ to Jesus, write in my journal, and then choose a reading from either the book

called ‘The Quiet Mind’ or ‘The Way It Is: New and Selected Poems’ by American poet William Stafford.

This morning when I opened ‘The Quiet Mind’ this is what was written on the page before me: ‘When your tasks seem a little heavy and overwhelming remember just to do one thing at a time quietly, and leave the rest because the rest is not your job. What you cannot get through you must hand back to God, and God will work it out for you.’

-We have 25 new Shop Riverside Cards. I will talk to Sarah about letting the church know.

-I was contacted by the First Five organization and asked if we could use a donation of diapers, wipes, children's' face masks, spray disinfectant and gloves. I replied yes and have been instructed to pick it up September 14-17, 8:30-4:00 on Technology St. I have no idea how much, but really, we could use any amount.

Pacifica Synod News and Updates

“Undoing Racism” Training Workshop

October 20–22, 2021

Luther Glen Farm Retreat Center



Pacifica Synod Equity, Diversity & Inclusion Work Group is pleased to announce that the “Undoing Racism” Training Workshop postponed from April 2020 has been rescheduled to October 20-22, 2021 at Luther Glen Farm Retreat Center. Registration is now open through October 15.

Workshop Description

The fabric of racism is inextricably woven into the structures of every system and institution in our society, including the church. The workshop will focus on understanding what racism is, where it comes from, how it functions, why it persists and how it can be undone through effective anti-racist organizing with, and in accountability to the communities most impacted by racism.

This will be a faith-based anti-racism workshop that will explore how to bring about change within the church and how the church can participate in ending racism in society. By the end of the workshop, participants will be enabled to take further steps in the long-term task of creating an anti-racist church.

This workshop is open to lay and rostered leaders and will fulfill the 2019 Pacifica Synod resolution requirement for rostered leaders to complete an anti-racism/diversity training at least once every three years. The workshop is limited to 32 participants.

Bishop Andy Taylor has announced he will not seek a second term as Bishop. We will elect voting members to the Synod Assembly at our annual meeting. Prayerfully consider if you might be one of them!

Dear Members and Friends of the Pacifica Synod,

In May of 2022, the Pacifica Synod will hold a Bishop's election. Since January, I have been discerning whether or not to allow my name to be on the ballot. I have prayed, listened for God's guidance, and at times wrestled with God over this issue. I have worked with a Spiritual Director, and listened to pastors, deacons, laypeople, friends, and family, as God often speaks to me through other people. I have come to the conclusion that I am not being led to seek a second term. Therefore, I will not allow my name to go forward next May when the Pacifica Synod elects a bishop. I believe God is leading me in a different direction, and thus God is leading the synod to a new bishop.

This has not been an easy decision. It has been an honor to serve as your bishop, and I am proud of what has been accomplished. I have continued to stress that we in the synod are to preach the gospel, love one another, and serve our neighbors. The synod has a strategic plan to guide us in this work, with four Mission Result areas: Strengthen Support for Congregational Ministry, Support Resilient and Faithful Leaders, Deepen Diversity and Inclusion, and Reshape the Pacifica Synod for Sustainable Ministry. We are working on goals through teams and workshops to help bring about these Mission Result Areas. We have a hard-working, dedicated staff with whom it is a pleasure to work, who are strategizing on how to reach these missional goals and offering support to others in this work. We have a great Synod Council, led by Vice President Nicolette Rohr, that is ready and willing to work on them as well.

But I do not feel called to continue the work beyond August of next year. In September of 2022, I will turn 65, and I am finding that I do not have

the energy for this job, particularly for travel, that I used to have. Prior to the pandemic, I spent about a week each month on the road. Travel has already begun to pick up and I'm ready for that to end. But more than that, I feel that God is pulling me toward something different. It may be back to congregational ministry, as I have missed being with one congregation, preaching among them, teaching and learning from them, strategizing for ways to share the gospel with neighbors and those in need. Or God may be leading me to a time of rest for a while. I am not sure where God is leading, but only know that it is right for me to step away from this office as of August 1, 2022.

For these reasons, I will not allow my name to go forward. There are many fine pastors in our synod and throughout the ELCA who would be an excellent fit for this role. My prayer is that the person God wants to serve will be moved to allow their name to go forward and that the Synod as whole will benefit from their wisdom and experience.

Until next August, I will continue to work as your bishop. I will do my best to continue to equip, accompany, and support our rostered ministers, lay leaders, congregations, institutions, and agencies. I look forward to continuing the work for the next 11 months. I trust that in May, God will provide the right person to lead the synod into the future.

Thank you for your support, your prayers, and your encouragement. I will miss the relationships I have built with the rostered and lay leaders of Pacifica. Thank you to the many who encouraged me to allow my name to go forward—your comments caused me to pause, pray, and listen for God in a variety of ways. But I do believe this is the right decision. I will keep praying for the right next bishop to be elected in May at our Synod Assembly.

Finally, I leave you with these words from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians: I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. (Philippians 1:3-6). From my first day in office until now, you have been generous in sharing in the work of the gospel. God will continue to work among you, both during my remaining months among you and as you select your next bishop. God bless us as we work together for the next 11 months, and God bless the synod as you discern whom God is calling to be your next bishop.






